What is a Policy?

A **policy** is a <u>principle</u> or protocol to <u>guide decisions</u> and <u>achieve rational outcomes</u>.

A policy is a statement of intent, and is implemented as a procedure Including a:

- Purpose statement
- Applicability & scope
- Effective date
- Responsibilities
- Policy statements
- Background
- Definitions (Anderson, 2005)





Policy & governmental instruments

Governmental instruments to implement a stated policy:

- Regulatory / legislative
- Information (education / advocacy)
- Financial (taxation, subsidies, trading schemes)
- Voluntary agreements
- Public services





Policy making process

Politics meets policy:

- Agenda setting: Framing & Prioritisation
- Links with themes and departments
- Consultation / democratic process
- Orientation: regulation-deregulation

Top tips from the discussion

- Start with the ones who want to change
- Connect with enthusiastic entrepreneurs to share a good story with society
- Broad collaborative approach to connect stakeholders to remove unnecessary barriers, create capacity building via voluntary agreements
- Waste fee to make wasteful behaviour expensive / tax reduction for food bank donations
- Set a national goal, for others to follow up
- Maximise dissemination, using viral marketing and connecting with younger generation with short, targeted messages
- Legislation & compliance & practical application should align & improve understanding of each other
